Dear families,

The new school year is off to a great start. I hope you have been able to hear from your children about the new things they are learning. The first few weeks are always an important time for establishing routines at school just as it is important to get into routines at home. There is also an eagerness to learn that is more evident early in the year as students want to meet the expectations set forth by teachers.

During these first few weeks of the new school year, our students take the NWEA test. Some of our students have already completed testing to establish a Fall baseline. NWEA is an adaptive achievement test that gives our teachers a baseline for where our students are performing in different academic areas. This test helps us to track individual and whole class learning growth over time. The adaptive component means that as students answer questions correctly or incorrectly, the questions get more challenging or less so in order to create a profile for what each child knows and is ready to learn. As a school, this data is valuable to look for trends in the data and provides a good read as to how our students compare nationally and within the diocese.

This next week, we welcome Chris McKenna, founder and president of Protect Young Eyes, an organization that advocates for protecting children from harmful online content and providing parents with tools for navigating the technological reliant age that our children are growing up in. McKenna will be presenting to students during the day with age appropriate presentations about responsible use of the internet. In the evening on Tuesday, Sep 26th at 7 p.m. at SFX School, there will be a parent presentation on how to create a tech-ready home. I encourage our school families to attend this event with a nationally renowned expert and speaker. How society uses

technology is rapidly evolving, and for kids growing up now, the tech world of today is vastly different from how it was in previous generations including when we were growing up. This is a great opportunity to be informed about safety and parenting in our tech driven world.

Our school staff look forward to working with you throughout this school year, and seeing the growth of each child. My favorite part of being an educator is seeing the growth in students over time as they show perseverance in overcoming obstacles and develop self-confidence. We treasure each child in our school and are happy to be in partnership with you in your child's education.

Parking: We were recently notified that there is a change in policy by the Downtown Management Board. This will affect how parking meters are enforced, notably that there are no longer "grace periods" at pick up time. Please note that if you park at a metered parking spot, that if you are in your vehicle waiting to pick up children, or leave your vehicle, the City expects that the meter is utilized beginning at 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. Monday-Saturday. The Downtown Parking Services Office has informed us that the removal of the grace period will take effect starting October 1st.
